SUNDAY READINGS:

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

The liturgy of the Church abounds in the celebration of Christ's kingship: the Kyrie, Gloria, Te Deum, the celebration of Epiphany, Palm Sunday and the Ascension. In 1899 Pope Leo XIII dedicated all Christians to the Sacred Heart under the special title of Christ's universal kingship. In 1925 Pope Pius XI established the last Sunday of October as a special feast in honour of this diving reign. This celebration has been transferred to the last Sunday in Ordinary Time to underline the indissoluble relationship between Christ's rule and the perfection of creation in the endtime.

Today's gospel draws our attention to the relationship between the endtime and our life. Christ the King will preside over the judgment, whose outcome will be determined by our care for one another. We should not dream about heaven as an escape from present responsibility.

We already live in the presence of the Son of Man. His special dwelling is among the needy. Our attention to Him there opens us to His full revelation as the ruler and judge of the endtime.

This leads us to a more authentic understanding of Christ as King. To proclaim Him king is not to demand a state religion. Jesus will claim His full title of king only at the hour of His coming in glory. But He lives now no less as king in a hidden way in the poor and the little ones. He is spirits who prowl about the the defender of their rights and their appointed protector. In serving the poor, we serve Him.

- 1. St. Ambrose: "Christ enters by the open door; he has promised to come in, and he cannot deceive."
- 2. St. Columban: "Christ is the fountain of life and spiritual illumination; for from him come all these things: wisdom, life and eternal light."

- **9.** St. Ignatius of Antioch: "Let us not be insensible of Christ's loving kindness. For if he had acted as we do, we would have been lost indeed."
- **10.** St. Bonaventure: "Christ is both the way and the door."
- 11. St. Leo the Great: "By dying Christ submitted to the laws of the underworld; by rising again he destroyed them."
- 12. Blessed Isaac of Stella: "Bringing salvation through wood and through water, Christ is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world which he took upon himself."
- 13. St. Cyril of Alexandria: "Through Christ we have gained access to the Father, for as Christ himself says, no one comes to the Father except through him."
- 14. St. Clement I: "Beloved, Jesus Christ is our salvation, he is the high priest through whom we present our offerings and the helper who supports us in our weakness."
- 15. St. Cyril of Alexandria: "Christ is the bond that unites us, because he is both God and man."
- 16. St. John Chrysostom: "Moses raised his hands to heaven and brought down manna, the bread of angels; the new Moses raises his hands to heaven and gives us the food of eternal life."
- **17.** St. Gregory of Nyssa: "The mind of Christ is the controlling influence that inspires us to moderation and goodness in our behavior."
- 18. St. Margaret Mary Alacogue: "The sacred heart of Christ is an inexhaustible fountain and its sole desire is to pour itself out into the hearts of the humble so as to free them and prepare them to lead lives according to his good pleasure."


